When we suspected that our child had a hearing loss, we took her to the Center for Hearing and Communication. At CHC we found warm and caring professionals who helped guide us through the overwhelming decision making process, helping us to develop our next steps. Melissa began intensive speech and language therapy at CHC and learned to talk. CHC emphasized that our involvement as parents was critical to her progress and development. CHC also helped us to see that Melissa was just like any other kid; she just happened to have a hearing loss.

Melissa was mainstreamed throughout her entire education, which included graduating from Yale

University and receiving her law degree from Georgetown University. She recently passed the Bar and is currently a practicing attorney in Washington D.C. She also has lots of friends and a full and active social life. In short, she is doing great!
